Did you know? The Barleycorn is named after an old folk song that dates back to the 16th century. The song is the allegorical tale of the death and resurrection of John Barleycorn, the personification of barley. In accordance with the various stages of cultivation, John Barleycorn is attacked and tortured as the barley is reaped and malted. In Autumn, he is harvested and the townspeople turn John Barleycorn into beer and whiskey. They toast him as they drink his "blood", and their joy abounds (the drunker n' drunker they get).
